Responsible to: Camp Director

Overview

- Possess strong skills in leadership, supervision, programming, communication, organization and coordination
- This position is responsible for the supervision and programming for up to 12 campers

General responsibility: To provide education and supervision to campers and to be responsible for their camp program.

Qualifications:

- Extensive experience as a teacher or instructor of their given craft
- Mature and willing to accept responsibility
- Believe in the individual worth of the camper
- Have enthusiasm, patience, integrity and a sense of humor
- Love the great outdoors
- Passion to work with children and appreciate the camp environment
- Must have a current criminal background check

Specific Responsibilities:

- Be responsible for the planning and implementing the daily art program provided for the camper
- Organize and instruct a program to be performed/presented/displayed on the last day of each given camp session
- Be responsible for ongoing communication of program needs between program and activities staff.
- Coordinate with other staff (counsellors, teachers, directors) matters of interest in areas of overlapping responsibility while always seeking the best solution for campers and the camp

- Coordinate and deliver a program that accommodates the various age groups and levels of skill.
- Be responsible for the health and welfare of campers
- Keep a running inventory of all equipment and supplies and inform the Director of any damage to property, or order requests
- ***For Off-Season School Program Teachers: Provide schools/classroom teachers with follow-up information and how your workshop meets school curriculum**

Essential Functions:

- Visually observe the performance as well as the behaviour of campers in their care, and be able to provide guidance as needed
- Visually identify hazards in the camp operation and respond appropriately
- Be able to work with a minimum of supervision and work effectively in a team environment delivering positive camp programming
- Be able to work and communicate well with a variety of age groups
- Using resources at hand when, making do with what is available
- Be prepared for the unexpected, when natural forces take over
- Provide feedback near the end of the session outlining their experience and suggestions for upcoming summers.
